- New Knowledge The musical styles range from Country to Cape Reggae to Ballads. The songs describe the positive side of life in Cape York communities.

3. Research Significance

• Evidence of Excellence – The Black Image Band won the Deadly Sounds Awards *Best New Band* category (2007) and was distributed nationally by MGM/Planet Records and also via the Australian Music Radio Airplay Project.
